Opportunity Leads to Discovery at the Colonial Complex

In the last edition of Chronicle, an article featured the partnership between the Trust and the Northern York County Historical and Preservation Society that will bring a replica squirrel tail bake oven to the Colonial Complex. Led by Sam McKinney, who restored Dill's Tavern in Dillsburg, three preservation workshops, stone masonry, oven construction and timber framing will culminate with a functional bake oven. The original historic location of the bake oven is known to have been located directly behind the General Gates House summer kitchen. Due to the presence of a utility shed that encloses the original space, the initial plan was to reconstruct a working replica elsewhere on the grounds of the Colonial Complex.

However, around the same time that the Trust was planning the bake oven project, another Colonial Complex building, the Colonial Court House, was getting an HVAC upgrade with a conversion to a new geothermal system. In contrast to the original Court House ventilation system, the geothermal unit did not require space in a mechanical building located behind the Court House. Thus, an opportunity presented itself to relocate the tools, equipment and other materials stored in the utility shed behind the Gates House summer kitchen to the now empty mechanical building. With the utility shed now accessible, reconstructing the oven at its original location proved feasible.

The first step was to provide McKinney with a concrete block foundation for the oven. The Kinsley Education Center agreed to send a crew over to dig out the footer, and to then return to lay the blocks. However, their work was cut short because they discovered the original 18th Century stone foundation after only digging a few inches below the brick floor of the shed. This surprising, but nevertheless remarkable, discovery will enable visitors to see and understand the reconstructed bake oven in its authentic historical context.

McKinney's will hold a Bake Oven Construction class on June 23, 24, and 25. The Timber Frame class will not be needed for the oven due to the presence of the shed; instead, it will be taught on site at Dill's Tavern. Classes are by registration only. All workshop proceeds benefit the Northern York County Historical and Preservation Society.
